Congregational History

Congregation Shearith Israel, the
Spanish and Portuguese Synagogue
in the City of New York, founded in
1654, was the first Jewish congregation
established in North America. Members
of Shearith Israel struggled for and
won religious and civil freedoms for Jews
in America. They played an important
role in the American Revolution, and were
actively involved in civic life. As the
only Jewish congregation in New York City
until 1825, Shearith Israel provided
for all the needs of the Jewish community.

Shearith Israel and its members have been and continue to be an integral part of New York City and its Jewish community, founding and active in many leading institutions including Mt. Sinai Hospital, the New York Stock Exchange, Montefiore Hospital, the Lexington School for the Deaf, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, the Sephardic Studies Program of Yeshiva University and many more. Notable members have included the poet Emma Lazarus, whose words adorn the base of the Statue of Liberty; Maude Nathan the suffragist and social reformer; and Supreme Court Justice Benjamin Nathan Cardozo. From 1907-1970, Shearith Israel was led by Dr. David De Sola Pool, an ardent Zionist, and prolific writer and translator whose works are widely used to this day.

CONSECRATION ANNIVERSARIES

Shearith Israel's first permanent home was erected on Mill Street in 1730. As the congregation and the city grew, Shearith Israel moved to larger quarters. We mark the inauguration anniversaries of our five synagogue buildings annually. On these days, the Torah scrolls are dressed in the pastel mantles usually reserved for holidays, and additional songs of thanks are included in our service.
