I also find it objectionable. It reverses the standard presumption of innocence until guilt is proven.

I agree and this is getting to be a big political problem, which is that law enforcement presume guilt and then bans activities. This is not a safe way to preserve democracy and personal freedom. However, coins represent a unique problem because of their value and portability and high level of theft (not to mention fraud). I wouldn't prevent cash sales, but I would insist on pedigree inquiries for any substantial coin purchase, so over \$500 US? Also the third party graders would have far more coin data to track coins through the market with something more than an assigned serial number.

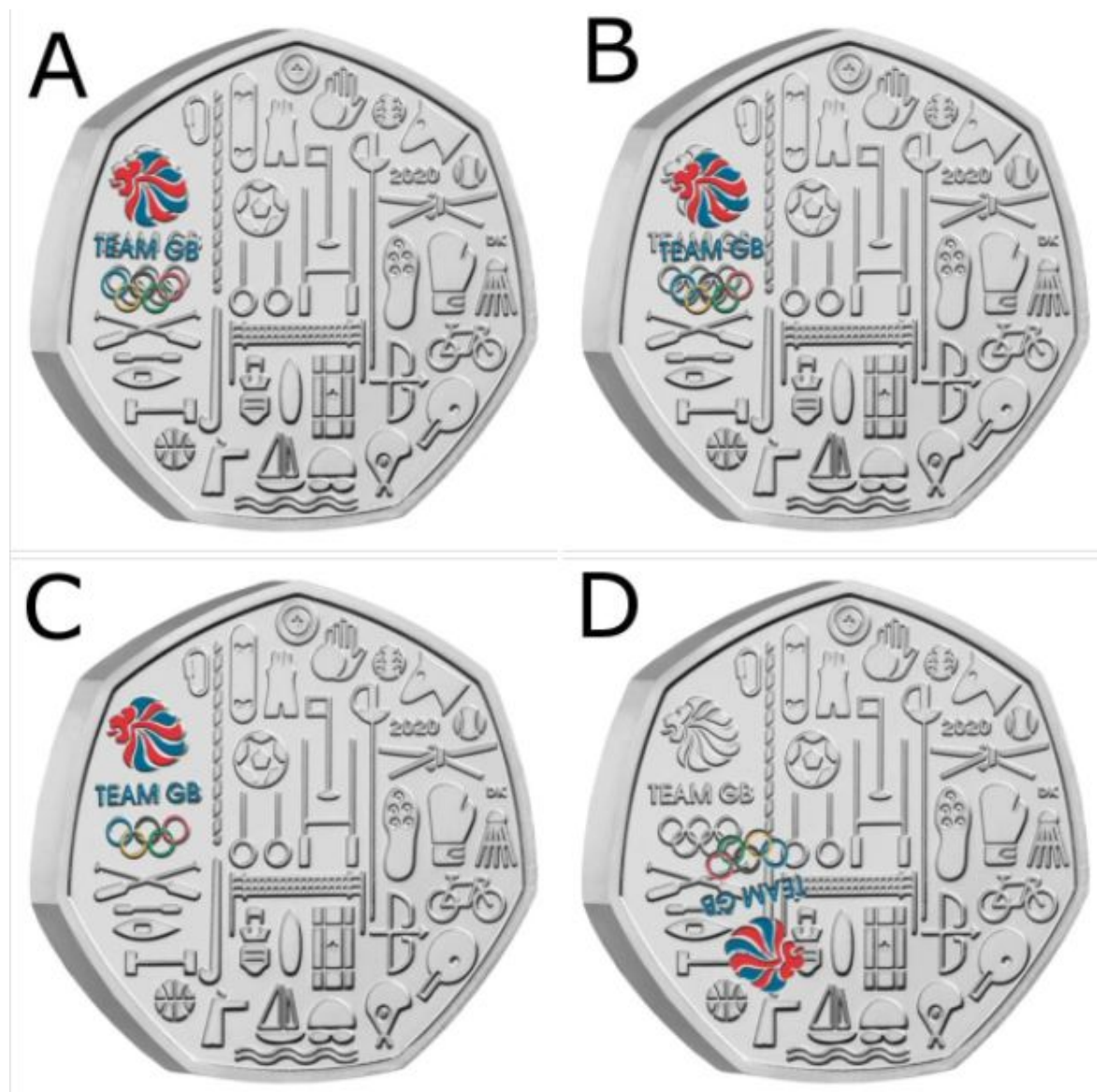
